This subject will suit you if:

• You are creative, imaginative and you enjoy exploring ideas and concepts.

Studying Art and Design you will enjoy developing your understanding of the visual world, learn practical skills and respond to artists and themes in ways that are personal to you.

Art and Design offers opportunities to use your creativity to express yourself. You will develop your understanding of creative processes, your ability to observe and to think, to solve problems and to communicate in a visual way. It will enable you to work independently and to make your own discoveries by exploring ideas, other artists' work and different materials and techniques. Fine art gives you the skills and knowledge to create personal and imaginative work. If you have an adventurous, creative and enquiring mind and are excited by shaping and determining the visual world around us, there is a career opportunity waiting for you.

 Art and Design is a great companion to all other subjects as creativity, imagination and problem solving skills can give you great ideas for your other subjects.



Provisional Entry Requirements

B or above in GCSE Art. Students who have not taken Art at GCSE will still be considered but must be able to demonstrate appropriate skills. The ability to draw is essential.



What You'll Study

During the course you will build knowledge and understanding in traditional media such as painting, drawing, printmaking, graphics, mixed media and sculpture and you will also have the opportunity build skills in new media like Photography or Moving image (animation, film and video). You will learn how to develop projects which respond to the work of artists and which produce creative ambitious outcomes.

AS assessment

At AS you will produce a portfolio of work for component 1 which counts for 60% ofyour total AS marks. In component 2 you will produce personal work in response to one of five exciting starting points which will count for 40% of your total AS marks.

A-level assessment

At A-level for component 1 you will develop work for a personal investigation into an idea, issue, concept or theme supported by written material. This will count for 60% of your total A-level marks. In component 2 you will produce personal work in response to one of eight exciting starting points which will count for 40% of your total A-level marks.


